BOB HOOVER TRIBUTE

The purpose of the film is to celebrate the spirit of the American fighter pilot, show the courage and the innovation that was essential to the birth of the jet age, and to enable the audience to relive incredible stories from a man born of simple beginnings in Tennessee who lived his dream of becoming the pilot he always wanted to be.

Accomplished test pilot, pace plane pilot for the Unlimited Reno races, air show pilot -R.A. "Bob" Hoover was considered by Jimmy Doolittle to be "the greatest stick and rudder man who ever lived."

The Bob Hoover Project is collecting stories, images, and footage of Mr. Hoover over the years to include in the upcoming feature documentary, "The Bob Hoover Project: Flying the Feathered Edge."
