LUKE AUX 1 ILS PRACTICE APPROACHES

Chapter member Dean Gilderoy sent along an interesting letter from the 56th Fighter Wing at Luke Air Force Base. After a many year break, the Air Force is going to allow civilian aircraft to shoot low approach ILS practice approaches at Aux 1. There is a list of common sense conditions that must be met. like Luke RAPCON must be open and the weather must be VFR. While this may seem like a small thing, it is really good news for instrument training and currency requirements. Before this, anyone wanting to shoot a practice ILS had to go to Gateway, Casa Grande, or Prescott. With the increase in regional airlines flying in and out of Gateway, there are many days when they turn down most requests for practice approaches. If you want a copy of the

NO MORE FREE APPS FOR PILOTS

The FAA's AeroNav Division decided at a meeting in Washington, D.C. this month that the end is coming to free FAA data to iPhone, iPad, and other tablet type navigation tools. Currently the data is essentially free to developers and even end users.

At the same time, the FAA organization put forth a plan to charge end users - pilots - \$150 a year for the data. AeroNav said it has a \$5 million budget shortfall this year that it is trying to eliminate. Among the questions are, will users who buy multiple apps have to purchase the data anew for each? Will developers who distribute chart images on an irregular basis, such as AirNav, the airport resource, be required to charge each viewer \$150? The cutoff date for the availibility of free FAA Charts is April 15, 2013.

COOL AIRPLANE STUFF

Just when you thought you had heard of everything and wondered what the next "new" thing in aviation would be, well it's here! VoiceFlight's VFS101 is an FAA certified speech recognition system that allows pilots to enter waypoints and airways into their GNS430W/530W GPS units up to ten times faster than is possible using the tedious concentric knobs.

VoiceFlight Systems announced at AOPA Summit in Palm Springs, California that they

will be introducing the VFSXP1, an Experimental / LSA version of the VFS101. It offers the same functionality as the VFS101, but at the low price of \$995.

Additionally, they will be unveiling and demonstrating the new HELO101, a new version of the VFS101 pilot speech recognition system optimized for helicopter use. The HELO101 allows pilots to enter latitude / longitude destinations into their GPS and tune Nav and Com radios without taking their hands off the primary flight controls. PAPER FAA CERTICATES – PLEASE READ

If you have already replaced your paper airman or mechanic certificate, then this message is not for you. On the other hand, if your FAA certificate is still printed on paper, please read carefully.

The FAA is under a mandate to replace all paper certificates with plastic certificates. If you do not replace your paper certificate on or before March 31, 2013, you will no longer be able to exercise your privileges!

All certificated Airmen, including mechanics, repairmen, flight navigator, ground instructor, balloon pilots, etc., are required to replace their paper copy with a plastic copy, or they will no longer be able to exercise the privileges of that certificate.

The best way to get a new replacement certificate is to follow the instructions at http://www.faa.gov/licenses-certificates/airme-n-certification/certificate-replacement/.

The replacement cost is \$2.00, unless you still have your Social Security Number on your certificate and you ask to have it removed.

temporary certificate issued under § 61.17 or a student pilot certificate issued under paragraph (b) of this section, the holder of a paper pilot certificate issued under this part may not exercise the privileges of that certificate after March 31, 2010.

Flight crewmembers other than pilots (flight engineers & navigators) - 14 CFR 63.15 (d) Except for temporary certificate issued under § 63.13, the holder of a paper certificate issued under this part may not exercise the privileges of that certificate after March 31, 2013.

Airmen other than flight crewmembers (mechanics, aircraft dispatcher, repairman, parachute rigger) - 14 CFR 65.15 (d) Except for temporary certificates issued under § 65.13, the holder of a paper certificate issued under this part may not exercise the privileges of that certificate after March 31, 2013.
