CHAPMAN RANCH USERS AND AVIATION ENTHUSIASTS

Check the new Phoenix Sectional...Chapman Ranch has been added and the identifier is 58AZ.

The second Chapman Ranch Fly-In went off without a hitch, thanks to efforts of the hard working APA Volunteers. The Arizona Pilots Association collected about \$300 in donations. Unfortunately, the donations are not going to offset the annual \$500 lease and the \$2,800 insurance expenses. The Lease and insurance payments are due by May 15, 2009 and the APA needs an additional \$3,000.

To give you a brief background on 58AZ, the APA leased the property on 05/15/07. This was our first attempt at opening a backcountry airstrip to flyers in AZ similar to the backcountry flying opportunities that are available in UT and ID. Additionally, 58AZ is an asset to the community for emergency and general access. 58AZ was intended to be a building block for future airstrips and, so far, it has been successful thanks to the many

efforts of volunteers, donations from interested parties, corporate sponsors and the APA. If you have followed its development over the last couple of years the airstrip has been transformed from a cow pasture to an airstrip that can be used safely by a wide variety of aircraft, which makes it appealing to more than Super Cubs and, not to mention, Huskys.

The APA has forked out about \$5,500. in seed money to start this venture, but cannot continue to fund 58AZ. On Thursday, 05/14/09, the APA Board of Directors will vote on a motion to continue funding the airstrip. This motion is not expected to pass without your support. If the APA is going to be

successful at opening airstrips in AZ, they will have to be self-sustaining. There are 70 aircraft registered to use 58AZ. If, for each registered aircraft, the APA received a \$43 donation, we could continue to keep 58AZ open for one more year. We will continue to work with the Pleasant Valley community to support and contribute to the keeping the airstrip open, but for this year the primary support will have to come from the registered and potential other users or enthusiasts.

CASA GRANDE BREAKFAST FLY-IN

Everyone is invited to fly on down to Casa Grande for their monthly Fly-In Breakfasts from 0700 to 1000. Starting in June the breakfast will be moved to the last Saturday of each month.

The really nice thing about this event is they have an indoor air conditioned terminal building to have the event. The breakfast hasscrambled eggs, sausage, pancakes, coffee and cactus juice; there is a \$7.00 charge which goes to support local charities.

PHX TERMINAL CHART CHANGES

The Phoenix Terminal Area Chart became effective May 7, 2009 and like most of you, I need to go buy one. The new chart features some enhancements to make flying in the Class Bravo more user friendly. These include a new East/West Route, Gila Route, and Canal Route, that will each have separate route descriptions on insets to a new panel on the chart. Moving the East/West route descriptions off the map to the insets has reduced clutter on the map. Since the airspace frequencies change according to the runway flow at PHX in some areas, a table has been added to the Gila and Canal routes showing the frequencies in use at pertinent geographical points to assist in contacting the correct controller. This table is also useful in determining frequencies in use for other routes of flight as well. assumption for the frequencies is that initial contact is made below the Class B.

NOTE: The Floors of the PHX Class B airspace are the altitudes that large turbine aircraft are cleared to and operating at! (Emphasis added) This is particularly true for arriving commercial aircraft descending on the arrival and being sequenced to the downwind, base legs, and final.

That being said, it would not be unreasonable to be denied Class B clearance on the Gila/Canal route during peak periods. On the departure side during west traffic, southbound departures often have to tunnel under arrivals near Gila Crossing which may delay receiving a Class B clearance.

Bottom line: buy the new chart and spend a few minutes reading it. An altitude bust in your home airspace is like backing over the neighbor's mailbox!

MUSTANG CAFE KPRC

The Mustang Café at Legend Aviation gives Prescott bound pilots an additional restaurant at KPRC in addition to Susie's Café in the main terminal. Located in the just opened FBO on the south side of the field, the Mustang Café is open from 7:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. daily.
